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Message from the President

The conversation around energy in Canada is shifting. Canadians are calling for energy solutions that are low-emission, reliable, affordable, and offer choice – and they include propane.

A recent poll commissioned by the CPA revealed that despite government focus and subsidies on electricity, most Canadians have a positive perception of propane. Regardless of education, income, region, or political leaning, those aware of propane see it as a lower-emission, cost-effective alternative to heating oil and diesel, particularly for rural and Indigenous communities.

This data reaffirms that the CPA is on the right path. Since the launch of our Three-Year Strategic Plan, our messaging has underscored that all Canadians, no matter where they live, should have access to lower-emission energy to heat their homes and businesses. In rural, remote, and Indigenous communities lacking access to natural gas and electricity, propane plays a vital role in delivering affordable energy.

Our recently updated data for our national and regional profiles aligns with these poll results. The propane sector's contribution to Canada's GDP has grown to \$5.9 billion, up from \$5 billion in 2018. The number of households using propane as their primary energy source has nearly doubled to 285,827, up from 150,390 in 2018. In Ontario, this number has tripled. The data shows that propane is especially critical in Canada's North, where it accounts for nearly 5% of total energy demand, supporting heating and mining operations.

The CPA's activities have focused on education, a key pillar in our strategy, to raise awareness about propane's benefits, sustainability and safety. In 2024 alone, our team attended over 100 government meetings, participated in over 20 events, and our social media campaigns garnered over two million impressions. Members have actively contributed in many of these endeavors, supporting the CPA mission. This activity is consistent with what was achieved in 2023.

Of particular interest, the poll results also highlight that a sizable portion of Canadians have yet to form an opinion on propane. This represents a tremendous opportunity for our industry to continue shaping the narrative.

Over the next year we are staying the course, executing the final year of our strategy and continuing to raise awareness and engage with governments, stakeholders, and the public. The data indicates we are on the right track and that the CPA and members' hard work is producing results. It's gratifying to see the positive impact of these efforts coming to light.

But as the data also shows, we still have much work to do, and we must continue building on the momentum we have created. We are looking forward to working with you in 2025 and seizing on the opportunities ahead. Thank you for your dedication to advocating for propane and your commitment to advancing our industry.

As an association, our goal is to deliver value to our members. This question guides everything we do, and we hope you feel the benefits of being part of the CPA.

Message from the Chair, CPA Board of Directors

As we look ahead to another productive year for our industry, we must reflect on our progress and the opportunities ahead. Propane continues to be recognized as a cleaner energy source utilized by millions of Canadians. Telling our story remains just as crucial today as it was a decade ago, especially as we face challenges from government restrictions and the push toward electrification. As efforts to reduce emissions continue, we need to engage with officials to highlight propane's advantages and secure its place in the market. I encourage each of you to talk about propane and your business to your local politicians. There is no shortage of benefits to talk about.

A key area of growth is the development of renewable propane. It can be used alone or in blends with propane or other renewable sources such as DME (dimethyl ether). These innovative solutions are already emerging in other markets, including the U.S. The CPA released its [Propane Decarbonization Roadmap](#) for Canada to demonstrate that we can develop our own renewable propane domestically. This is an exciting opportunity and signals a long-term future for our industry.

The industry is seeing a rising demand for propane-powered backup generators for residential, commercial, and public service highlighting propane's reliability during extreme weather and urgent events. Governments must be reminded that propane is "emergency's first responder".

In residential and agricultural sectors, propane is key in transitioning to dual-energy systems, providing a reliable, lower-emission option for Canadians without access to natural gas. The CPA has been steadily promoting their use to governments, particularly in rural Ontario and Atlantic Canada. The shift from oil to propane/air-source heat pumps for heating and greenhouse operations enhances reliability and reduces environmental impacts, creating growth opportunities for our industry.

In the construction sector, propane remains the preferred choice for temporary heating, particularly for road and bridge projects. Propane is also a preferred choice by businesses to power their fleets because it offers cost, power, and range advantages. The CPA has been pushing

these benefits and calling on governments to remove the fuel tax on propane.

Our industry has advanced with new technologies like real-time monitoring systems, GPS-assisted delivery planning, and geolocation software. These innovations not only optimize transportation, cut costs, and reduce environmental impacts, but they show our industry is continually adapting and is committed to long-term sustainability goals.

Meet with your politician, talk about the good work your companies are doing and the innovation that keeps driving our industry forward.

While we continue to advance our industry, safety must always remain a top priority. The CPA works closely with regulators Canada-wide to uphold the highest safety standards, ensuring propane remains a trusted energy source. Our commitment to compliance, training, and safety is essential, with the CPA's Propane Training Institute playing a key role in safe installations and protecting both our staff and the public.

I encourage you to utilize the services of PTI – not only are you ensuring your staff receives quality training and expert professional services, but you will also be supporting your association.

Lastly, I want to acknowledge our leadership team for its efforts during the recent railway sector conflict, where the government recognized the need to ensure propane availability for Canadians. The CPA's work has solidified propane's position as an essential service in Canada.

Looking ahead, propane will continue to be a critical energy source for Canadians. Your involvement today is key to our future success. You can count on the CPA board, staff, and resources to support you as we work together to strengthen our industry and ensure our voices are heard.

Government Outreach Strengthening Industry Voice

Measuring Value

Government meetings and outreach initiatives enable the CPA to influence political discussions by tackling key policy and regulatory challenges that significantly impact the propane industry.

Government Meetings

Lobby Days

- **Ontario lobby day – February, Toronto:** 12+ government official meetings.
- **Special event for Saskatchewan CPA members – June, Regina:** Networking with government officials.

One-on-One Meetings

- **Over 100 meetings** were held with government representatives of all stripes and levels across Canada.

Official Proceedings

- **Standing Committee on Finance and Economic Affairs – January, Toronto:** CPA board member Jason Cooper participated in the Ontario government public hearings to relay the importance of energy choice for rural Ontarians.
- **Manitoba Standing Committee on Social and Economic Development – November (2023), Winnipeg:** CPA advocated for an amendment to The Fuel Tax Amendment Act to include propane in the list of fuels eligible for a fuel tax holiday.

Policy Changes

British Columbia

- The Low Carbon Fuel Standard (LCFS) B.C. policy **now references the CPA's lower carbon intensity for propane** in western Canada – 73 gCO₂e/MJ.
- The City of Vancouver **reversed its ban on natural gas heating** in new buildings, following advocacy from the CPA and other industry groups promoting energy choice.
- The provincial government announced **an extension of its initial timeline to require all new vehicles sales in B.C. to be zero-emissions** by 2035 following advocacy from the CPA and other stakeholders.

B.C. and Ontario

- Bulk truck drivers and Bulk Plant Operators now authorized to use PTI tank evacuation training for changing pressure relief valves in B.C. Ontario is following suit.



Railway Strike Prevention Efforts

The efforts of the CPA, along with other industry groups, prompted the Canadian Industrial Relations Board (CIRB) to review the impact of a rail strike with a specific focus on the propane sector. While the CIRB did not classify railways as an essential service, the CPA successfully demonstrated that propane is a critical and essential energy.

- The CPA worked with members to gather examples, data and information to communicate the significant impacts of the rail strike on the propane sector. Social media campaigns over the summer relayed the importance of propane use for Canadians.

Submissions

CPA has presented **17 submissions to governments across Canada**, covering numerous topics and recommendations [Federal – 5](#), [British Columbia – 4](#), [Alberta – 1](#), [Saskatchewan – 1](#), [Manitoba – 1](#), [Ontario – 2](#), [Atlantic Canada – 2](#), [The North – 1](#). These submissions encompass a broad range of issues, including rail strike concerns, oil and gas emissions cap and budget submissions.

Participation in Policy-Focused Groups

The CPA regularly collaborates with like-minded associations and coalitions to enhance advocacy efforts. The CPA is a member of the following groups:

- **BC Business Caucus:** Provides a platform to inform decision-makers about propane's role in provincial policy and regulatory conversations and participate in industry coalition submissions.
- **Hearth, Patio, and Barbeque Association:** Addresses challenges related to potential prohibition of natural gas and propane appliances in certain Canadian jurisdictions.
- **Energy Connections Canada:** Mobilizes the Canadian energy pipeline industry to influence an evolving energy sector.
- **Canadian Association for Energy Contractors:** Advocates for the Canadian energy services industry near the wellhead, promoting their leadership and role in global energy evolution.
- **Saskatchewan Chamber of Commerce:** Organizes collaboration with other like-minded groups to advance the CPA's advocacy agenda for Saskatchewan.
- **NRCan Rail Group:** Dedicated to addressing rail service concerns.
- **Environmental Emergency Plan Regulatory Working Group:** Focuses on developing revisions to the federal government's Environment Emergency Regulations, 2019.
- **Industry Steering Committee on Climate and Clean Air:** Offers a forum to engage on broad Environment and Climate Change Canada regulatory impacts and changes.
- **Multi-Association Council for Transportation of Dangerous Goods:** Provides a forum to discuss changes to Transport Canada regulations.
- **Supply Chain Operations Table - Transport Canada:** Offers an opportunity to address supply chain disruptions.

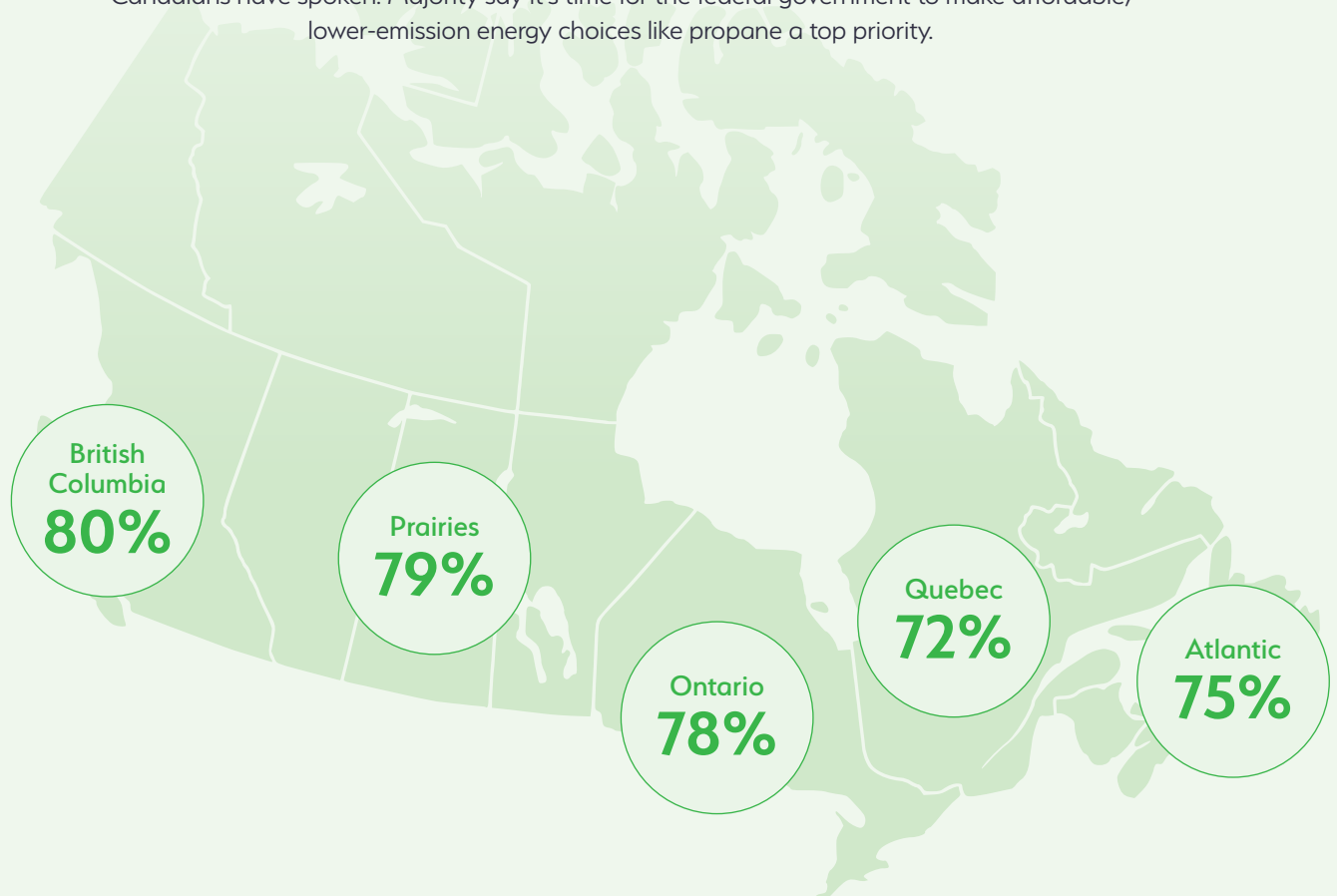

Propane’s Popularity is Growing Across Canada

Canadians have spoken: Majority say it’s time for the federal government to make affordable, lower-emission energy choices like propane a top priority.



Reduced Regulatory Burden

- **Improved safety for propane truck drivers:** [Equivalency Certificate SH 14614](#) for CPA members removes the unsafe practice of drivers needing to crawl under the vehicle to close the belly valve before and after each fill.
- **Significant changes for B149.2.2030:**
 - 20lb and smaller cylinders allowed in cages without vehicle protection.
 - Permission to fill cylinders based only on the markings on the collar.
 - Changes allowing public to fill propane vehicles without training requirements.
- Transport Canada **updated its ERAP Online Services platform** to make it easier for ERAP plan providers to manage and update their data.
- Manitoba **no longer requires double Jersey barriers** for vehicle protection, which were previously mandated to safeguard tanks at work sites.
- After engaging with the CPA, Ontario **reversed its restriction of Chek-Lok excess flow valves** for permanent applications when properly sized.
- CPA-led code changes prompted Ontario's Technical Standards & Safety Authority to **eliminate costs for underground tank permitting**.
- Newfoundland established auto-propane requirements to allow propane **bus operators to refuel without government oversight**.
- Consistent regulatory engagement with Transportation Safety BC, Alberta Municipal Affairs, Technical Safety Authority of Saskatchewan, and Technical Standards and Safety Authority-Ontario.

Conferences – CPA Participation

- CPA staff presented/participated in over **22 events** throughout this year.
- First-ever **CPA NPGA Expo Breakfast for members:** CPA-hosted NPGA networking breakfast in Charlotte, NC on April 5.

Growing CPA's Propane Training Institute

- PTI launched its **first virtual, live instructor-led Train-the-Trainer course** in January.
 - To-date, **32 new trainers** added for a total of 64 trainers across the country.
- Hosted **first webinar** on the Transportation of Dangerous Goods, more to come!
- **Trainer Committee actively engaged**, including helping to align PTI training materials with the latest regulations. Top five courses revamped with new resources.
- **Technical Safety BC approved PTI course** [Evacuation of Propane/LPG from Horizontal ASME Tanks – 100-15](#)
- **Active member of the Canadian Rental Association**, platform to connect with the rental and construction industry.

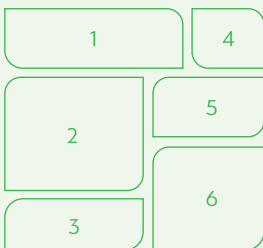

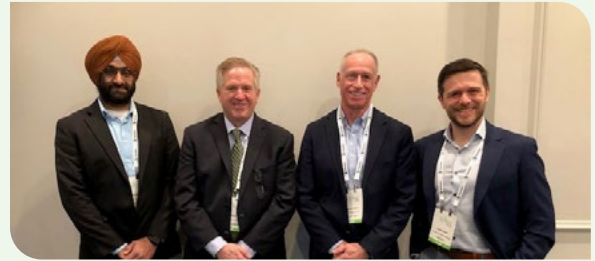
